

## S. John's Churchyard Memorial Garden Regulations

- 1. Application for the interment of ashes should be made to the Incumbent, who will decide the place of interment
- 2. The ashes are placed directly into the earth, in a designated plot 6" x 6".
- 3. The names of those whose ashes are interred in the Garden, together with a record of where the ashes are interred, will be recorded in a register, to be kept in the Church safe, and entered in the Memorial Book.
- 4. A grid plan of interments is kept at the Church
- 5. A Memorial Book is kept in the Church, in which entries are made, subject to the approval of the Incumbent, by a calligrapher approved by the Incumbent.
- 6. No monument or vase may be put on any grave
- 7. Cut flowers may be put in the Church or by the Churchyard Memorial Crucifix. Wreaths may be put by the Churchyard Memorial Crucifix. When withered, cut flowers and wreaths may be removed by the person responsible for the upkeep of the Church and Churchyard.
- 8. No artificial flowers may be placed in the Churchyard.
- The fees for the interment of ashes, or for additional inscriptions in the Memorial Book shall be fixed by statute or by the Parochial Church Council
